Meet will be swum short course under SNZ/World Aquatics rules except where local rules and conditions apply. Para swimmers are eligible to compete at this meet and shall compete under WPS swimming rules. All events will be swum as timed finals with over the top starts.

Self marshalling will operate throughout the meet.

Protests shall be lodged as per SNZ policy 008 along with \$100 cash.

All events will be swum and scored in the following age groups for both male & female:

50m & 100m all events: 9/u, 10, 11, 12;

200m Backstroke, Breaststroke, Freestyle & IM: 10/u, 11, 12;

200m Fly, 400m Freestyle & IM: 12/u.

Awards

Wellington Swimmers - The top 3 Wellington swimmers placing in each event will receive a Gold, Silver or Bronze medal.

Visitors - a maximum of 2 visitor medals will be awarded in any one event.

Ribbons - will be available for collection for swimmers finishing in the top 10 who did not receive a medal.

Medals will be presented throughout the sessions. Club uniform tops for medal presentations. Same gender substitutes permitted.

Age group points will be earned as 20, 14, 10, 7, 6, 5, 4, 3, 2, 1 for first to tenth inclusive.

The Porirua City Aquatics Cup:-

This will be awarded to the Wellington regional club that has the highest point score at the conclusion of the last session.

Six (6) SwimHub vouchers will be given away during the event. 1 male and 1 female name will be drawn out each session and announced for collection.

Entry Details

This meet is open to financial SNZ registered competitive swimmers. Overseas competitors may compete subject to providing a signed Travel Authorisation Form/Letter from their national federation.

Age as at 21st September 2024.

Qualifying times must have been obtained between 21st September 2022 and the entry closing date of 15th September 2024 and be held within SNZ database. Converted times are permissible.

Entry fees are \$14.00 per event per swimmer.

Entries and payment will be via the SNZ Database, pay later not an option.

Entries will open on Sunday 18th August 2024.

Entries close at 23:59:59 (Midnight) on Sunday 15th September 2024. Late entries will NOT be accepted.

There will be no refunds for withdrawals after entries close.

Initial psych sheets will be posted on the website on Monday 16th September and programmes finalised at midday Friday 20th September 2024.

By entering this meet, swimmers agree to allow images (e.g. photography, video, etc.) to be taken by accredited media approved by Swimming Wellington. Images are only to be used for legitimate purposes by Swim Wellington in accordance with the SNZ Member Protection Policy.

Swimming Wellington reserves the right to restrict entries and amend the programme and will not be liable for any loss, damage or injury that may occur at this meet.

All Participants must agree to comply with the Sports Anti-Doping Rules.

Strapping of muscles/joints is not permitted unless supported by a doctor or physio certificate and sighted by the Technical Director prior to the first session the strapping is applied.

Para Swimmers

Classified para swimmers (including those with provisional classification) are eligible to compete at this meet.

Entries for para swimmers must be submitted manually by email to louise@swimwn.co.nz on or before Sunday 15th September 2024.

Para swimmers are requested to report to the Technical Director prior to the commencement of the first session they attend.

Withdrawals

Swimmers may withdraw without penalty from Session 1 by emailing the louise@swimwn.co.nz (Event Manager) before 5pm Thursday 19th September 2024 or with the recorder at the venue by 1.45pm for Session 1.

For subsequent sessions, withdrawals must be submitted with the recorder before the completion of the session prior.

Withdrawals that fail to comply with these conditions, or swimmers who fail to marshal, **may** incur a \$30 penalty. Valid medical certificates will be taken into consideration.

By entering this meet, swimmers agree to allow images (e.g. photography, video, etc.) to be taken by accredited media approved by Swimming Wellington. Images are only to be used for legitimate purposes by Swim Wellington in accordance with the SNZ Member Protection Policy.

Warm-Up

Warm-up duration: - 30 minutes.

First 20 minutes - general warm up (no dive lanes)
Feet first entry.

Lane 9: - Designated to para swimmers for the first 20 minutes of each warm-up - if any.

Lanes 0/1/2 & 7/8/9: - To become dive lanes for the last 10 minutes of each warm-up.

Lane 3: - Designated pace lane.

Please exit the pool at the side. Do not swim over lane ropes or climb over touchpads.

Club & Spectator Information

All participating Swimming Wellington clubs will be required to provide volunteers for door, hosts, runner, medals and refreshments. Swimming Wellington will send a request to all clubs.

Spectator entry fee; \$3 for all 16&O.

A seating plan will be published on the SW website on Wednesday 18th September.

Entry for nominated team coaches & team managers will be limited to the following numbers: -
1 - 10 swimmers - 1 coach & 2 team managers
11- 20 swimmers - 2 coaches & 3 team managers
21 - 35+ swimmers - 3 coaches & 4 team managers.

The names of Coaches and Team Managers for this event must be emailed to louise@swimwn.co.nz

Two (2) programmes for each club can be uplifted by the Team Managers from the signing in desk on entry and will be available via wellingtonswimming.org.nz.

Entry for all swimmers, officials, team managers and coaches will be via the main entrance.

Swimmers and coaches to present Swimming Wellington pool entry passes. Coaches must display their NZSCTA cards throughout the meet, only swimmers and coaches with NZSCTA passes will be permitted to enter the coaches area.

Team Managers must show passes at the door.

Visiting clubs will be issued with temporary entry passes for the meet. These can be uplifted by Team Managers from the sign in desk.

The results will be published on Meet Mobile - these are unofficial until the referee has signed them off.

Disqualifications will be announced, and can be viewed / photographed at the recorders desk.

Spectator entry fee; \$3 for all 16&O.

The Swimming NZ Code of Conduct and Media and Photography position statement in the Swimming NZ Member Protection Policy Manual apply to all competitors, volunteers and spectators entering CAC. The Manual can be found on the Swimming NZ website [here](#).

There will be a team manager meeting in the meeting room at 1.45pm on Saturday.

Officials information

All participating Swimming Wellington clubs are required to provide officials for this meet. RTOP will send this request to clubs. Qualified visiting officials are welcome and may apply via email RTOP@swimwn.co.nz.

All qualified officials are required to have been police vetted.

Officials (including timekeepers and duty club volunteers) are required to sign in on entry.

Officials to bring their own water bottles.

There will be an officials meeting in the meeting room 20 minutes prior to the start of each session.
